Before his election to City Council, Courtney was a teacher at Western Canada High School, a basketball coach, and an equity, diversity, and inclusion facilitator. He graduated from Mount Royal University with a degree in history and the University of British Columbia with a degree in education.

Courtney is a strong community advocate, builder, and organizer; his life has been dedicated to helping people realize their place in the world. In 2020, Courtney petitioned the Calgary Board of Education to form an anti-racism task force and helped to bring together 15 community organizations to successfully advocate for \$8 million in additional community funding from The City of Calgary.
